## The Mitzvah List for Parashat Bo

P153 To sanctify the new moon [Rosh Chodesh], i.e., to declare the new month. Exodus 12:2

P55 To slay the pesach at the specified time. Exodus 12:6

P56 To eat the meat of the pesach. Exodus 12:8

N125 Not to eat the pesach unless it is completely roasted (i.e., neither under-cooked nor under-roasted nor boiled). Exodus 12:9

N116 To leave no meat of the pesach uneaten until morning. Exodus 12:10

P156 To remove all chametz from one's property on the fourteenth day of Nisan. Exodus 12:15

P158 To eat matzah on the [eve of the] fifteenth day of Nisan, (i.e., the evening of the Passover). Exodus 12:18

N201 Not to possess any chametz during all seven days of Passover. Exodus 12:19

N198 Not to eat or create a mixture of grain and liquids that would constitute chametz during the seven days of Passover. Exodus 12:20

N 128 Not to give an apostate Israelite any part of the pesach to eat. Exodus 12:43

N126 Not to give part of the pesach sacrifice to a God-fearer (ben Noach) or partial proselyte to eat. Exodus 12:45

N123 Not to remove any part of the pesach from the house where it is eaten. Exodus 12:46

N121 Not to break any bone of the pesach. Exodus 12:46

N127 Not to give part of the pesach sacrifice to any uncircumcised person to eat. Exodus 12:48

N197 To eat nothing containing chametz during all seven days of Passover. Exodus 13:3

N200 That no chametz should be seen with us (i.e., in Jewish homes or property) during Passover. Exodus 13:7

P79 To consecrate all firstborn of clean flocks and herds (i.e., domesticated sheep, goats, and cattle). Exodus 13:2

P157 To recount the story of the exodus on the eve of the fifteenth of Nisan. Exodus 13:8

P81 To redeem the firstborn of a donkey. Exodus 13:13

P82 To break the neck of an unredeemed, firstborn donkey (i.e., to behead it, kill it). Exodus 13:13
