P232 To abide by the law of the Jewish servant in the land of Israel during a Jubilee year. Exodus 21:2

N261 The buyer of a Hebrew maidservant may not sell her again to another man. Exodus 21:8

N262 Not to diminish a wife's food, clothing, or conjugal rights. Exodus 21:9

P227 The Sanhedrin's (religious court in Israel) authority to administer the death penalty of strangulation. Exodus 21:12

N319 Not to strike one's father or mother. Exodus 21:15

P226 The Sanhedrin's authority to administer the penalty of decapitation. Exodus 21:20

P237 To judge cases involving damages caused by domestic animals. Exodus 21:28

N188 Not to eat the meat from an ox sentenced to death by stoning. Exodus 21:28

P238 To judge cases involving damages caused by a pit. Exodus 21:3

P239 To exact proper payment from a thief. Exodus 21:37(22:1)

P240 To judge cases caused by domestic animals. Exodus 22:4(5)

P241 To judge cases involving damage caused by fire. Exodus 22:5(6)

P242 To judge cases involving an unpaid custodian. Exodus 22:8(9)

P246 To judge cases brought by litigants. Exodus 22:8(9)

P243 To judge cases involving a paid custodian. Exodus 22:9(10)

P244 To judge cases involving borrowed property. Exodus 22:13(14)

P220 To judge cases involving one who seduces a virgin. Exodus 22:14(15)

N310 Not to allow a sorcerer or witch to live. Exodus 22:17

N252 Not to oppress the stranger even if only verbally. Exodus 22:20

N253 Not to oppress the stranger in matters of money or property. Exodus 22:20

N256 Not to oppress any orphan or widow. Exodus 22:21

P197 To lend to the poor in accordance with one's means. Exodus 22:24

N234 Not to act as a debt-collector towards one's neighbor. Exodus 22:24

N237 Not to participate or help in any way with a loan at interest between Jews believers. Exodus 22:24

N315 Not to speak evil of a judge. Exodus 22:27

N60 Not to blaspheme the divine name of God. Exodus 22:27; Leviticus 24:16

N316 Not to speak evil of a ruler. Exodus 22:27, Leviticus 24:16

N154 Not to separate the dues from produce out of proper order. Exodus 22:28

N181 Not to eat the meat of a torn animal. Exodus 22:30

N281 Not to accept the testimony of a litigant in his opponent's absence. Exodus 23:1

N286 Not to accept the testimony of a known wicked person in court. Exodus 23:1

N282 Not to follow a majority of one in deciding a capital case. Exodus 23:2

N283 A judge may not accept his colleague's opinion of a ruling, but must understand the matter for himself. Exodus 23:2

P175 To follow the majority rule of the court. Exodus 23:2

N277 Not to rule in favor of the poor litigant because of pity. Exodus 23:3

P202 To unload a burdened animal, even if it belongs to one's enemy. Exodus 23:5

N278 Not to pervert justice for a wicked person. Exodus 23:6

N290 Not to condemn a person to death without at least two qualified eye-witnesses. Exodus 23:7

N274 A judge may not take any bribes or accept any gifts from litigants whose case he is trying. Exodus 23:8; Deuteronomy 27:25

P134 To leave the land fallow in the seventh year. Exodus 23:11

P154 To rest on the Sabbath day. Exodus 23:12

N14 Not to take or impose an oath in the name of any idol or false god. Exodus 23:13

N15 Not to entice one's neighbor to idol-worship. Exodus 23:13

P52 To appear at the Temple for Pesach, Shavuot, and Sukkot with a prescribed animal offering. Exodus 23:14

N115 Not to slay the pesach while in possession of chametz. Exodus 23:18

N116 Not to leave the sacred portions of the pesach until morning. Exodus 23:18

P125 To bring the first fruits to the Temple. Exodus 23:19

N186 Not to cook meat in milk. Exodus 23:19

N48 Not to make a covenant with any of the seven nations of the land of Canaan. Exodus 23:32-33

N51 Not to permit an idolater to live in the land. Exodus 23:33
